## What is a Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner?

The Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) is a registered nurse who has been specially trained to care for the complex issues surrounding victims of sexual assault. The purpose of this training is to teach interested Registered Nurses how to better care for their patients by recognizing, collecting and preserving evidence, interviewing victims and linking them to vital community resources for follow-up care.

### Course Description:

This 40-hour didactic course is geared towards the Registered Nurse, but is informative for physicians, law enforcement officers, prosecutors and victim advocates. It is designed to provide comprehensive education program in the complete assessment, evaluation and treatment of the adult sexual assault survivor.

Upon completion of the 40-hour didactic training, there is a post-training of 40-hours of clinical requirement that must be completed according to the nurse's scope of practice and guidelines of the training course. The presenter, Diana Faugno, will set these guidelines out during training.

### RNs must attend all four days of training to receive credit for this course.

This course meets the educational guidelines of the International Association of Forensic Nurses.

*Prior to training, nurses contracted through IAASA are required to purchase (or borrow) and complete as much as possible of the DVD, Sexual Assault: Forensic and Clinical Management. Nurses not contracted through IAASA are suggested to purchase and review beforehand.
